Interviews

For our interviews for this magazine release we asked the language teachers at Northampton High about what led them into a career of teaching.

What made you want to become a language teacher?

"I've always known I wanted to be a teacher but then I didn't know what subjects I wanted to teach, so I went and did a year abroad being a French assistant and I really enjoyed it so I thought that I would be a language teacher."

What made you want to become a language teacher?

"I just got really interested when I was learning English. I was really really interested by trying to decipher what the lyrics in songs meant because in France you are more exposed to English songs and English programmes... so trying to understand what was actually going on is what really got me into it. And I was also really interested in history so I decided to go and do an English degree but also looking at the linguistic and looking at the culture and the history... I studied English history, American history. I studied the linguistic, the grammar, translation; I did a lot of that as well at university, and then i just went away after my studies to be a language assistant... and I really liked it and wanted to come back. At first I wanted to come back home and teach English in France to French students, but no, i decided that England was the place I wanted to be"

What's your favourite language to teach? Why?

"I love both French and Spanish but I probably say that Spanish is my favourite to teach, as the head of Spanish. Possibly as well because I have that little extra connection through my family and through Spain. I spent a little bit longer living in Spain as well."

Why do you think that people should learn a language?

"I think it's part and parcel of being a global citizen. I think people who speak English predominantly, think I don't need to learn a language because everyone speaks English is plain arrogant. I think it says something very negative about their attitude to being a global citizen. It's about so much more than communication, it's about understanding somebody else's culture, somebody else's language, someone else's view of the world. And that is part and parcel of being a global citizen.."

What made you want to become a language teacher?

"I changed high schools after a year, so I did French and German in my first year and I loved German. I think it's such a fun language to learn. I like the way it sounds, so I was a bit sad to not carry it on but then when I changed schools I got to do Spanish so that was really nice because then it gave me the opportunity to connect with the language that I had encountered through my family and through travelling, so then I went to do French and Spanish and it just sort of came naturally to me in terms of understanding and vocabulary learning, although I did nearly drop French at GCSE because I couldn't get my head around Mrs Vandertramp and the perfect tense but eventually I cracked it. I think I was going to take geography and then my French teacher took me to one side and said "Seriously, come on. You can do this" and the rest is history. ."

What's your favourite language to teach? Why?

"So I prefer to teach Spanish because I learnt it as a student so I find it easier to explain rather than explaining French which is my language as it's easier to teach something you've learnt yourself"

What's your favourite cultural aspect of the language that you teach?



"Germany's not really renowned for the good quality of it's cuisine. I love their cakes and ice cream but I think more than anything it's possibly actually the art because I also love art. When I lived in Berlin I spent a lot of time in art galleries and there were some really forward thinking avant garde Germans and German speaking artists particularly in the earlier part of the 20th century. So literature and art, again going back to literature I really loved English and literature so that's been a real motivator for my German as well."

LANGUAGE TIPS

1

Change the language set up on your phone to the language you would like to learn to get familiar with it!

2

Get in touch with people from the country who's language you are talking to. You could reach out to relatives or get involved with the school's Pen Pal programme for German!

3

Get used to hearing and looking at the language you are learning by watching TV programmes in that language, listening to foreign songs and reading foreign books.

4

Utilise all your resources. Make use of documents that your teachers give you and remember to use apps like Quizlet and Duolingo which use active recall techniques.

5

Try and integrate the language you are learning into your daily life. You could try and have a conversation with a friend who is also learning the language to practice speaking and recalling vocab.

Recipes

RASGULLA (the lovely food which was made for the Diwali assembly)

INGREDIENTS:

CHENNA:

1 LITER FULL FAT MILK
2-3 TBSP LEMON JUICE
1 LITER ICE WATER

SUGAR SYRUP:

200G SUGAR
750ML WATER
1/2 TSP ROSE WATER



METHOD:

BRING MILK TO A BOIL IN A POT
ADD 2 TBSP OF LEMON JUICE AND STIR UNTIL THE MILK CURDLES
ONCE THE MILK HAS CURDLED COMPLETELY, TURN OFF THE HEAT AND
LET THE MILK REST FOR 2 MINS
POUR ICE WATER INTO THE POT
PLACE A COLANDER OVER A BOWL AND LINE IT WITH A THIN CLOTH
DRAIN THE CURDLED MILK
RINSE THE CHENNA TO GET RID OF ANY LEMON FLAVOR
TIE THE CLOTH AND SQUEEZE IT TO REMOVE AS MUCH EXCESS
WATER
HANG THE MIXTURE FOR 2 HOURS INTO IT IS CRUMBLY
ADD SUGAR, ROSE WATER AND WATER TO A CLEAN POT
DISSOLVE SUGAR AND BRING TO A BOIL
AFTER 2 HOURS, KNEED THE CHENNA FOR 5 MINS, UNTIL SMOOTH
TAKE SMALL PORTIONS OF THE DOUGH AND ROLL INTO SMALL BALLS
(16)
BRING THE SUGAR SYRUP TO BOIL THEN SWITCH TO A MEDIUM
FLAME
ADD THE BALLS AND OVER THE POT IMMEDIATELY
COOK ON MEDIUM HEAT FOR 10 MINS (HALFWAY THROUGH GENTLY
STIR), THE SYRUP MUST BE BUBBLING AND BOILING THIS ENTIRE TIME
AFTER COOKING KEEP THE LID CLOSED FOR AT LEAST 20 MINS
ALLOW RASGULLA TO COOL COMPLETELY BEFORE EATING

COCONUT BURFI

INGREDIENTS:

3 CUPS DESICCATED COCONUT
400G CONDENSED MILK
1/3TSP CARDAMOM
3 TSP MELTED BUTTER/GHEE



METHOD:

PUT A PAN ON LOW HEAT, ADD THE COCONUT AND CONDENSED MILK
COOK STIRRING CONSTANTLY FOR 2-3 MINS UNTIL IT IS A SEMI-SOLID CONSISTENCY
ADD CARDAMOM AND BUTTER AND COOK FOR AN EXTRA 2 MINS
DIVIDE MIXTURE INTO 2
ADD PINK/RED FOOD COLORING TO 1 OF THE HALVES
GREASE A CONTAINER AND LINE WITH PARCHMENT PAPER
ADD PINK COCONUT MIXTURE AND USE A SPATULA TO FLATTEN IT
ADD THE WHITE MIXTURE ON TOP AND SMOOTH IT OUT
PLACE IN THE FRIDGE FOR AN HOUR UNTIL SET



JALEBI

INGREDIENTS:

125G PLAIN FLOUR
15G CORN FLOUR
1/8TH TSP TURMERIC
120ML CURD/PLAIN YOGURT
1/2 TSP BAKING SODA
1TSP LEMON JUICE
1/3TSP CARDAMOM POWDER
1 PINCH SAFFRON
OIL/GHEE FOR FRYING
200G SUGAR
120ML-180ML WATER



METHOD:

ADD SUGAR AND WATER TO A POT
BOIL ON MEDIUM HEAT UNTIL IT REACHES A STRINGY
CONSISTENCY
ADD LEMON JUICE, CARDAMOM AND SAFFRON
REMOVE FROM HEAT, SET ASIDE
MIX TOGETHER FLOUR, CORN FLOUR, AND TURMERIC POWDER
ADD WATER AND MAKE A THICK BATTER, COVER AND FERMENT FOR
12-24 HOURS , IT WON'T RISE BUT SHOULD HAVE SMALL BUBBLES
ON TOP
HEAT OIL ON MEDIUM HEAT
ADD BAKING SODA TO THE BATTER
ADD BATTER INTO A BOTTLE WITH NOZZLE (SQUEEZE BOTTLE) OR
PIPING BAG WITH A SMALL HOLE
SQUEEZE IN THE BATTER IN CIRCULAR MOTIONS CREATING
SPIRALS
MEANWHILE HEAT UP THE SUGAR SYRUP
ONCE THE JALEBIS ARE CRISPY, ADD TO THE SUGAR SYRUP,
ALLOW TO REST FOR 2 MINS
SERVE JALEBI HOT OR COLD

GERMAN, RUSSIAN AND ARABIC



HOW ARE YOU FINDING LEARNING TWO BRAND NEW LANGUAGES?

IT'S DIFFICULT BECAUSE YOU HAVE TO FIND A LOT OF TIME TO STUDY THEM AND IT WAS ALSO HARD TO LEARN TWO NEW ALPHABETS, HOWEVER, I THOROUGHLY ENJOY THEM AND WOULD NOT WANT TO STUDY ANYTHING ELSE. I ADORE THOSE LANGUAGES, THEY ARE REALLY REWARDING AND THEY WILL HELP ME WITH MY FUTURE CAREER. LEARNING LANGUAGES AT SUCH A HIGH LEVEL IS A BIG STEP UP AND IT MOVES EXTREMELY FAST.

WHAT WAS YOUR FIRST EXPERIENCE WITH LANGUAGES?

I STARTED LEARNING FRENCH IN JUNIOR SCHOOL IN YEAR 1 BUT IT WASN'T MY FAVOURITE SUBJECT. IN YEAR 7 WE STARTED TAKING LATIN, GERMAN AND SPANISH AS WELL AS FRENCH WHICH I ENJOYED MORE. I HAD NEVER LEARNED THEM BEFORE BUT I FELL IN LOVE WITH THEM AND REALISED THAT I HAD A TALENT FOR THEM.

WHY DO YOU THINK THAT LANGUAGES ARE IMPORTANT?

WHEN I HAVE BEEN ON HOLIDAY, I GET A HUGE SENSE OF SATISFACTION WHEN I AM ABLE TO CONVERSE WITH THE LOCAL PEOPLE. NELSON MANDELA SAID, "IF YOU TALK TO A MAN IN A LANGUAGE HE UNDERSTANDS, THAT GOES TO HIS HEAD. IF YOU TALK TO HIM IN HIS OWN LANGUAGE, THAT GOES TO HIS HEART.". I CAN GET TO KNOW PEOPLE BETTER THAN IF I WERE TO SPEAK IN ENGLISH; GERMANS IN PARTICULAR SEEM FLATTERED WHEN THEY HEAR AN ENGLISH PERSON SPEAK TO THEM IN THEIR NATIVE TONGUE.

ALSO, IT'S A REALLY GOOD ADVANTAGE IF YOU'RE LOOKING TO WORK ABROAD IN PARTICULAR. WHILE I DON'T STUDY FRENCH AND DUTCH ANYMORE, MY PREVIOUS KNOWLEDGE, ON TOP OF MY CURRENT GERMAN, IS REALLY HELPING ME WHILE I'M APPLYING FOR SUMMER JOBS IN EUROPE.

I AM LOOKING FOR AN INTERNATIONAL CAREER, WHICH PROVIDES TRAVEL, AND SO WITH ALL OF THE LANGUAGES I CAN SPEAK, IT REALLY SETS ME UP WELL FOR THE FUTURE.

DO YOU BELIEVE THAT LEARNING LANGUAGES HELPS YOU WITH OTHER ACADEMIC SUBJECTS?

LANGUAGES REQUIRE A LOT OF DEDICATION, AND YOU SHOULD BE STUDYING VOCAB AND GRAMMAR EVERY DAY (TO KEEP DUO HAPPY!). THEREFORE, THE COMMITMENT TO THE LANGUAGE PROVIDES YOU WITH A REALLY GOOD WORK ETHIC. ALSO, LANGUAGES ARE REALLY GOOD FOR YOUR MEMORY, AS YOU ARE CONSTANTLY FEEDING YOUR BRAIN WITH NEW WORDS TO LEARN.

WHY IS GERMAN SUCH A UNIQUE LANGUAGE IN YOUR OPINION?

WHEN I STUDIED GERMAN AT SCHOOL, I ALREADY KNEW SOME FRENCH, LATIN AND SPANISH, WHICH ARE ALL ROMANCE LANGUAGES. THEY WERE ALL SIMILAR, SHARING SOME WORDS AND GRAMMAR RULES. HOWEVER, GERMAN IS A TEUTONIC (GERMANIC) LANGUAGE, AND SO WHILE IT IS IN THEORY SIMILAR TO ENGLISH, THERE ARE A LOT OF DIFFERENCES IN GRAMMAR AND VOCAB. IT CAN BE A BIT HARDER TO LEARN, BUT WHAT I LIKE IS THAT THERE ARE VERY FEW GRAMMAR EXCEPTIONS, SO ONCE YOU'VE MASTERED THE RULES, YOU'VE CRACKED IT. GERMAN IS ALSO VERY DIFFERENT TO RUSSIAN AND ARABIC, WHICH ADDS TO THE CHALLENGE OF MY DEGREE.

HOW HAVE YOU OVERCOME SETBACKS IN YOUR JOURNEY?

THERE HAVE BEEN A LOT OF SETBACKS THIS SEMESTER, AS I WAS GETTING TO GRIPS WITH THE RIGOUR OF TWO BEGINNERS' LANGUAGE (JUST DOING ONE IS SUPPOSED TO BE VERY INTENSE). I WAS REALLY BEHIND ON GRAMMAR AND VOCAB BECAUSE I WASN'T SURE AT FIRST HOW TO LEARN WORDS IN A DIFFERENT ALPHABET. I HAD TO BE QUITE CREATIVE WITH MY APPROACH TO STUDY, AS IT CAN BE THAT JUST POWERING THROUGH WORDS ON QUIZLET CAN EVENTUALLY BECOME LESS EFFECTIVE. IT IS WISE TO ALSO MEMORISE WORDS BY WRITING OUT SENTENCES AND WRITING SYNONYMS FOR NEW TERMS.

WHAT ARE YOUR FAVOURITE REVISION TECHNIQUES?

AT SCHOOL, I REALLY ENJOYED DOING PAST PAPERS, AND I REMEMBER DOING EVERY GERMAN GCSE EXAM PAPER FROM 2006 TO 2018 !! I ALSO LOVE DOING GRAMMAR EXERCISES AND TRANSLATING SENTENCES, WHICH HELPED ME LEARN VOCAB AND GRAMMAR IN TANDEM. ALSO, IT'S WORTH FINDING PODCASTS AND WEBSITES IN THE LANGUAGE. PODCASTS ARE GREAT BECAUSE YOU CAN SLOW THE SPEED DOWN IF IT'S A BIT TOO FAST! I LIKE THE DIE LAGE PODCAST AND I ALSO FOLLOW DER SPIEGEL ON SNAPCHAT!

WHAT ADVICE WOULD YOU GIVE TO SOMEONE THAT IS THINKING OF TAKING A LANGUAGE COURSE?

I'D SAY THAT YOU NEED TO FOCUS ON SETTING TIME ASIDE TO STUDY EVERY DAY; EVEN IF IT'S JUST FOR A LITTLE BIT, IT'S REALLY IMPORTANT TO. ALSO, AS WELL AS THE STUDYING AND REVISION, IT'S REALLY GREAT TO DEVELOP A PASSION FOR THE COUNTRY/COUNTRIES WHERE THE LANGUAGES ARE SPOKEN, SO THAT IT'S NOT JUST GRAMMAR AND VOCAB YOU'RE LEARNING, BUT A WAY TO CONNECT WITH A WHOLE NEW WAY OF LIFE. ALSO, IT'S GOOD TO MAKE THE MOST OF SCHOOL EXCHANGES AND TRIPS IF YOU CAN, BECAUSE YOU CAN PRACTISE YOUR LANGUAGE, MAKE MISTAKES, BUT ALSO GET THAT BUZZ FROM CHATTING TO FOREIGN LOCALS!! I DO THINK THAT LANGUAGES ARE FOR EVERYONE BECAUSE WE OFTEN FORGET TO REALISE THAT THERE IS MORE TO THEM THAN JUST A TEXTBOOK: LANGUAGES ARE ONE OF THE MOST LIVELY SUBJECTS TO LEARN, IF YOU THROW YOURSELF INTO THEM.

MARCH 2022





TIBETAN NEW YEAR, OR LOSAR, IS A FESTIVAL FOR TIBETAN BUDDHISTS. IT IS CELEBRATED FOR 15 DAYS, THE FIRST 3 DAYS BEING THE MOST SIGNIFICANT. IT IS CELEBRATES THE NEW YEAR, ON THE FIRST DAY (LAMA-LOSAR), IT IS TRADITION TO VISIT MONASTERIES AND RECIEVE BLESSING. THE SECOND DAY, (GYALPO-LOSAR, OR KING LOSAR) REPRESENTS AUTHORITY AND PUBLIC CELEBRATIONS ARE USUALLY DONE ON THIS DAY. THE THRID DAY, (CHOKYONG-LOSAR) PRAYER FLAGS ARE HOISTED ON HILLS AND HOUSES.

DURING LOSAR, ALTERS ARE DECORATED AS A THANK YOU TO LOCAL DEITIES FOR THE PAST YEAR, AS WELL AS FOR PROPSPERITY IN THE NEW YEAR. WEI SANG ALSO KNOWN AS THE BURNING PINE TREE BRANCHES, CYPRESS AND OTHER HERBS TO MAKE AROMATIC SMOKE AS AN OFFERING FOR GODS IS ESSENTIAL TO THE RITUALS ON DAY THREE OF THE CELEBRATION

HOLI, OR THE FESTIVAL OF LOVE AND COLOUR, IS ONE OF THE MOST POPULAR/WELL KNOWN HINDU FESTIVALS, MOST COMMONLY CELEBRATED IN INDIA. IT CELEBRATES THE TRIUMPH OF GOOD OVER EVIL AND THE BEGINNING OF SPRING. HOLI IS CELEBRATED BY THROWING COLOUR POWDER OR 'GULAL' AT EACH OTHER. PEOPLE WHO WORSHIP LORD KRISHNA ARE DRAWN TO THIS FESTIVAL AS IT IS SEEN TO BE SIMILAR TO HOW KRISHNA WOULD PLAY WITH GOPIS (DAUGHTERS AND WIVES OF COWHERDS)

SONGKRAN IS THE NAME FOR THAI NEW YEAR, IT IS A CELEBRATION OF LOVE AND THANK, THE WORD SONGKRAN IN SANSKRIT MEANS TO MOVE FORWARD. THROWING WATER HAS BECOME A LARGE PART OF SONGKRAN, CROWDS OF PEOPLE GATHER AND HAVE WATER FIGHTS, BUDDHISTS ALSO VISIT TEMPLES AND POUR WATER ON IMAGES OF BUDDHA OR ON BUDDHIST MONK'S HANDS AS A SIGN OF RESPECT. IMAGES OF BUDDHA ARE ALSO PUT UP AROUND VARIOUS CITIES SO THAT PEOPLE KEEP HIM IN THEIR MINDS.

VAISAKHI, OR SIKH NEW YEAR, ADDITIONALLY, IT CELEBRATES THE SPRING HARVEST IN PUNJAB. TO CELEBRATE, SIKHS WORSHIP AT GURDWARAS AND ENJOY PARADES THROUGH THE STREETS CALLED NAGAR KIRTAN, TRADITIONAL CELEBRATIONS INCLUDE SINGING HYMS AND READING SCRIPTURES, MANY SIKHS ALSO BELIEVE THAT THE NEW YEAR IS THE DAY TO BECOME PART OF THE KHALSA BROTHERHOOD. FARMERS LIVING IN PUNJAB ALSO USE THIS CELEBRATION TO GIVE THANKS AND HOPE FOR A PLENTIFUL HARVEST IN THE NEW YEAR.

IT ACKNOWLEDGES THE IMPORTANCE OF THE COCONUT AND INCLUDES STREET DANCING, MUSIC, COSTUMES AND HANDICARFTS. DANCERS WEAR COSTUMES HIGHLIGHTING THE COCONU, BY WEARING THEIR SHELLS TO SHOW THEIR IMPORTANCE.





THE KNEELING CARABAO FESTIVAL IS A UNIQUE FESTIVAL HELD IN PULILAN, BULACAN. USUALLY, NEARBY PROVINCES JOIN IN ON THE FUN AND TAKE PART OF THE PARADE OF DECORATED CARTS. THE CARABAOS (A TYPE OF WATER BUFFALO) HAVE BEEN TRAINED SINCE CHILDHOOD TO FOLLOW HAND GESTURES TO KNEEL. THE CARABOAS KNEEL IN FRONT OF THE SAN ISIDRO LABRADOR PARISH CHURCH AS A SIGN OF THANKS TO HONOUR THE FARMERS FOR THEIR HARVEST. DURING THE PARADE, THERE IS A MARCHING BAND ALL OVER TOWN WHILST THE TOWN WEARS COSTUMES OR BRIGHT COLOURS.
