Drama and Theatre

Key Stage 3

Pupils in Key Stage 3 are encouraged to feed their imagination and explore their creative potential in Drama lessons. The lessons are held in studio spaces and regular in-house performances offer encouragement and build confidence, as well as developing an exciting community spirit.

Many extracurricular opportunities are on offer including Drama Club, LAMDA acting examinations, House Plays and annual whole school musicals and productions. Theatre trips form another area of enrichment and we have previously visited the West End as well as local theatre venues. Facilities include a studio theatre and a large proscenium arch stage, with a professional lighting rig and sound equipment in both spaces.

Drama lessons allow pupils to be artistic and creative through various topics, exploring space and body language, the study of physical theatre and political theatre with approaches to modern theatre forms.

Students work from script and analyse characters and staging devices, as well as devising original theatre based around a stimulus. One topic is Verbatim Theatre where students get to experiment and create their own Living Newspaper.



Key Stage 4

GCSE Drama encourages creativity, with a focus on practical work that develops skills to support progression for further study of Drama and a wide range of other subjects. The set texts require students to articulate how they would perform in certain roles, and design selected scenes.

The experience of live theatre is integral to the course and previous trips include '1984', 'Hedda Gabler', 'Hamlet' and 'The Pitman Painters'. Pupils have also enjoyed workshops at Pineapple Dance Studios and with Frantic Assembly. Students have gone on to study Performing Arts and Musical Theatre at University and Stage Schools including LIPA and Mountview.
